What?

- KPUB has recently installed an Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Station.

Where?

- It's located on the ground floor of the Downtown Parking Garage at 201 Clay Street – convenient to downtown dining, shopping, and historical establishments.

More Details?

- It is open to the public 24/7 and FREE of charge!
- Reservations are not required - availability is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The station has dual ports (208/240VAC 60 Hz) which make it possible to charge two vehicles at a time.
- It is a ChargePoint station and will work with any electric vehicle on the market. The ChargePoint network is widely used by EV drivers, with over 21,400 available charging station locations.
