Sidney Baker Lane Closures

February 9, 2012

Beginning this Sunday, February 12, 2012, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will begin temporary lane closures in the 100 and 200 blocks of Sidney Baker. The two north bound lanes of Sidney Baker, beginning at the bridge, will be closed from 7:00pm to 6:00am each Sunday through Thursday. All lanes will be open from 6:00am to 7:00pm daily and on Friday and Saturday nights.

The Kerrville Public Utility Board (KPUB) will dig a trench on the east side of Sidney Baker's 100 and 200 blocks. This trench will house conduit for electrical, cable TV, and phone lines. The existing overhead lines will be transferred underground. Work will be done at night in an effort to inconvenience motorists as little as possible. Work is estimated to be complete in approximately four weeks.

Motorists traveling in this vicinity may encounter delays and are encouraged to consider using alternative routes, like G Street or Francisco-Lemos Street.
