Power Outage

May 4, 2018

Kerrville Public Utility Board (KPUB) officials reported a power outage Friday morning, which affected 252 customers in the Cully Drive area to La Casa Drive and to Guadalupe Street. The outage started at approximately 7:54 a.m., May 4, 2018 and power was fully restored to all affected customers by 8:31 a.m.

KPUB officials state the outage occurred when lightning caused a breaker at the Rim Rock Substation to lock open.
